- These programs are unique in composition, learning objectives, flexibility, diversity, customization, and market demand.
- Our cohort format for the doctoral programs welcomes students with diverse professional backgrounds in business, health professions, pharmacy, nursing, and education; the curriculum is collaboratively designed across these interprofessional areas and incorporates best practices from all these fields of study.
- Two start dates per year, January and June
- · Assigned dissertation chair from the beginning of the program
- Students are guided through research seminars leading to the successful completion of the dissertation and dissertation defense. Online check-in sessions with your advisor occur on a regular basis. Students work on their dissertation for course credit.
- PhD Only: Submit a manuscript to a peer-reviewed journal
- PhD Only: Submit a scholarly material to a conference or complete a face-to-face presentation in a professional setting
- PhD Only: Attend a conference and/or participate in dissertation defenses for other PhD students

RESIDENCY

Doctoral students are required to attend two in-person residencies during this program. Each residency will take place on our Mequon, Wisconsin campus. Here you will have the opportunity for learning, networking, and discussion with your cohort peers.

The first residency will occur in year one to start the program. The final residency takes place during the second year and it is always scheduled in the summer.
