SERVICES AND COSTS

CUW's Student Health Center strives to work in partnership with students to meet their health care needs while on campus. We are a convenient, efficient, confidential and affordable clinic right on campus. Staffed by nurses, nurse practitioners and physician assistants.

Appointments are strongly encouraged and can be made by phone call or walk-in. There is no office visit charge. Minimal charges will be billed to your CUW student account for complete physical exams, diagnostic testing, medications & treatments. Charges are discussed with you prior to treatment. We do not bill insurance except for diagnostic testing, if desired.



SERVICES OFFERED

- Complete physical exam for program or athletic requirement
- Vital sign checks
- Allergy injections as prescribed by your Allergist
- Diagnostic testing (strep, mono, UTI, etc)

REQUIREMENTS

- All students are required to complete the Health History and Tuberculosis Screening forms. If you will be living on campus, you must also complete a Hepatitis B and Meningitis form. All forms are online and accessible after you have registered for classes. Forms can be found on your CUW portal. Go to the Student tab and click the link to the Student Health Center patient portal.
- A physical exam is not required, although it is encouraged.
- Immunizations are not required but highly recommended. We recommend MMR, Tdap, Varicella, Hepatitis B, Meningitis, HPV, & Influenza vaccines.
- Certain programs of study require physical exams and immunizations.
- Tuberculosis testing is required for students with identifiable risk factors. All students that have arrived from or traveled to a country with a high incidence of TB must meet this requirement.
