

Leveling Program in Speech-Language Pathology

The **Leveling Program** in Speech-Language Pathology (SLP) is nationally recognized as a means of completing the requisite education to prepare a student for graduate study in SLP. The **Leveling Program** is intended for students who possess a bachelor's degree in a major other than Communication Sciences and Disorders (CSD) who are interested in qualifying for graduate study in Speech-Language Pathology. The CUW **Leveling Program** requires interested students to complete 30 credit hours (10 courses) in the CSD major which can be acquired in one-year of study prior to entering a graduate SLP program.
