Portfolio – During each week of the course, students will create components of their learning portfolio. Each portfolio entry must include these components:

- Write 2 paragraphs of at least 6 sentences on a learning standard
- Provide 5 artifacts (documents or presentations) that demonstrate student mastery of each of the standards. 25 total artifacts complete the overall portfolio
- Write at least 4 sentences describing each artifact
