HIST153: AMERICAN CIVILIZATION

Course Overview: This course is a survey of the history of the United States from pre-Columbian America to the present. It will explore the political, economic, religious, social, ideological, and artistic influences in the American story.

The course is designed to help students develop knowledge of broad areas of history; an appreciation of the major events in U.S. history; and the skills necessary to read, write and speak about U.S. history and historical writing. I 3 credits

Grading:

Weekly quizzes 30% Weekly discussions 30% Primary source essays 30% Final activity 10%

Attendance:

Attendance is recorded for each discussion or
assignment that is submitted. Students are
encouraged to log on about 4 times per week and
dedicate about 6 hours each week to their
coursework.

Assignments:

Quizzes: 75 minute open book quizzes covering the assigned reading material will be administered through blackboard learn.

Videos and discussions: online videos from the Annenberg/CPB series: *A biography of America* will be used as the basis for weekly discussions to examine our attitudes and behaviors.

Primary source essays: Students must submit 7 of the possible 14 primary source essays to analyze a document or media element. The 5 paragraph essay must summarize and analyze the artifact In historical context.

Final activity: This will require students to compose a 5 paragraph essay addressing a specific question about American Exceptionalism and its relevance to present day realities.

Students can access their course any time, from any location.

A laptop or desktop is recommended.



Students will set up a university email & use this while in the course.

Orientation will be required prior to the start of the course.
